# 311/05 OFFICE ACCOMODATION – REQUEST FROM REGISTRATION SERVICE

Wiltshire Registration Service are requesting permission to site more appropriate work station in the Council Chambers.

- d) If we are unable to accommodate them the Registration Service will probably look for alternative accommodation, which could result in a loss of income of £4,000 plus a charge of £1,000 for providing the Registration Service for weddings.

# 312/05 ARRANGEMENTS FOR CONSULTATION IN RESPECT OF THE ELCOT LANE TENNIS CLUB PROPOSALS.

The Town Clerk made the following statement –

The first issue is the clarification of the ownership of the Elcot Lane playing fields and the examination of the deeds in respect of any restrictive covenants. Once the Town Council's ownership is established and it can be confirmed there is nothing, which restricts its use, the Town Council needs to decide when and if it wishes to consult with all residents of Marlborough regarding the proposal for the tennis courts and if so the question will be posed i.e. as a separate leaflet, as part of the newsletter or through the press. At the same time consideration will need to be given to the process by which we will consult with the interested parties, I would suggest that the number of representatives needs to be limited and that the first meeting is held as an informal discussion to set future parameters for a full consultation on all aspects of the proposal.

This was suggested as a recommendation.

## 313/05 CHRISTMAS TREE RECYCLING

Town Clerk stated that although on the face of it the suggestion seems to be a good one there are concerns that the Town Council are being asked to ensure that the area is managed responsibly and this could result in a request for supervision which would have a cost implication for staff.

Following a discussion it was agreed unanimously that the Town Clerk will liase with Kennet and to go with her judgement.

### 314/05 REPAIRS TO THE TOWN HALL

a) West Elevation – A discussion took place as to whether the Town Council wishes to proceed with the repairs to a leak or do we wish to seek further investigations as to where the leak is coming from.

The following points were raised –

- i. Having just spent in excess of £90,000 why do we still have a leak.
- ii. Need to check on any guarantee we have.
- iii. Concerns were expressed about public liability if it turns cold this could become icy and therefore very dangerous.

Proposed by Councillor D. Parker, seconded by Councillor M. Cooper and –

RECOMMENDED: unanimously that -

the Town Clerk will contact Humberts to find out why this was not picked up during the restoration work and to look into what sort of guarantee we have. This will then be discussed at the next R & A Committee meeting.

b) Town Hall maintenance programme -

Town Clerk suggested that a maintenance programme should be established and recommended it should be discussed at Full Town Council.

Proposed by Councillor M. Cooper, seconded by Councillor P. Cossey and –

RECOMMENDED: unanimously that –

Marlborough Town Council should establish a rolling programme of maintenance this should be discussed further at the next Full Town Council meeting.

#### 315/05 EARMARKED RESERVE FOR PURCHASE OF REPLACEMENT TRACTOR

The Town Clerk stated that the existence of a reserve has now been identified and there are sufficient funds available to purchase a new tractor. This will need to be referred to F & GP for inclusion in the estimates. The Council felt that a breakdown into the condition of the tractor should be obtained before a decision can be made. However the use of a significant amount of reserves will have implications for interest income and other ways of funding the purchase of a tractor including the possibility of a good second-hand one.

RECOMMENDED: that the Town Clerk report to the F & GP.
