Bottles and cans are dangerous. Fruit and other food items cannot be left as they attract pests and animals



No decoration or any other item other than those set out below is permitted to be placed on or around graves.

Resin and plastic items, ornaments, candles, lantern and solar lights



Photographs and cards must be removed after two weeks and helium balloons must be removed after one week.

Please note no item must extend beyond the plot boundary.

Any items not complying with these regulations will be removed.



Small windmills and other similar ornaments.

Glass ornaments are not permitted



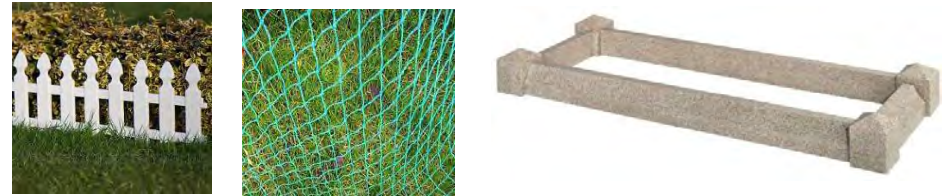
Fresh or silk flowers
in glass or pottery vases



Please note that all broken items will be removed

The following items are **not** permitted
on graves

Fencing, netting, artificial turf or kerbing around graves is not permitted as these stop our Grounds Team from being able to cut the grass properly and may result in damage to machinery



Any glass, pottery or ceramic items are easily broken causing a hazard when cutting and strimming the grass
